Glossary of Terms

Common Terms

NEET – Not in Education, Employment or Training. The NEET figure is the number of young people known to be in a NEET Destination.

Adjusted NEET – uses the NEET figure and adds a proportion of those whose destination is Unknown (based on a DfE formula used nationally).

BME – Black and Minority Ethnic.

DfE - Department for Education

Destination – the activity of a young person.

EET – in Education, Employment or Training. As with NEET, there is both an actual and an adjusted EET figure.

RPA – Raising the Participation Age. (https://www.gov.uk/government/policies/increasing-opportunities-for-young-people-and-helping-them-to-achieve-their-potential/supporting-pages/raising-the-participation-age)

LDD - Learning Difficulties and Disabilities.

Unknown – young people whose destination cannot be confirmed. A section of this group counts towards the adjusted NEET figure.

Destination Categories

Sixth Form – includes school sixth form and sixth form college.

FE College - Further Education.

Other Education – includes Year 11, higher education, education outside of area, gap year students and custodial sentences.

Non-Emp Training (FT) – includes full time provider-based foundation learning, non-employed apprenticeships and traineeships.

Employment (FT) – includes full time jobs with training and employed apprenticeships.

EET (RPA not met) - includes full time jobs without training and part-time education/ employment/ training.

NEET - Available – unemployed but potentially available for work.

NEET - Not Available – unemployed and unavailable for work, e.g. young carers and asylum seekers.

Other – includes unknowns, moved out of area, pregnancies, teenage parents, illness and unpaid personal development opportunities (activities to support young people to enter EET).

Note.

Due to rounding of multiple numbers the figures in some tables may not always add up to precisely 100%.

The data relating to the gender of the young people only includes those people who consented to having their gender recorded. As such the totals may not match the expected cohorts where a gender isn't logged.

Introduction

This booklet has been put together by the Youth Analysis Service (YAS) for schools and academies (referred to as establishments in this booklet) across Hampshire. It provides key figures for young people who completed Year 11 on 31st August 2014.

The topics covered in this report are based on the performance measures used by the Department for Education (DfE). Figures are given at establishment and Local Authority (LA) level.

This booklet acts as a resource for establishments to monitor their current performance, to plan future strategies and to spot potential issues before they arise.

This booklet is based on a cohort of young people who were recorded as being academically aged Year 11 and in an establishment in Hampshire as of 31st May 2014. The data relating to the cohort is a snapshot of their status as of 1st November 2014.

The following data and information in this booklet has been compiled from the Client Caseload Information System (CCIS) database used by the Youth Support Service (YSS) in Hampshire, Isle of Wight and Portsmouth. The content is generated by a program that identifies the destinations, as of 1st November 2014, of young people who completed Year 11 in the academic year 2013/14.

Due to Raising the Participation Age (RPA) legislation, as of September 2014, young people are now under a duty to participate in education or training until the end of the academic year in which they turn 18 (academic Year 13).

This is an important piece of education legislation with particular relevance to vulnerable young people. As a high performing education sector, nine out of ten young people in Hampshire already progress successfully to post 16 education and training. Due to this legislation, it is now even more important that our services support all young people with participating in post secondary education. Primary responsibility for providing independent and impartial careers guidance on participation options now rests with establishments directly.









Establishment Education Courses





Graph 6 shows that the general trend across Hampshire is for the majority of both genders go on to further education, with Sixth Form being the more common destination. This is to be expected as a result of the balance of sixth forms and FE colleges in Hampshire.

The percentage of Year 11 leavers not meeting RPA requirements is low for both genders (4% for males and 3% for females).



Graph 7 shows, amongst Year 11 leavers from The Westgate School, females are more likely to go on to 'Sixth Form' than males are, whereas a higher percentage of males than females move into 'FE College'.



Hampshire Leaver Destinations by LDD Status


Table 8 shows the leaver destinations of the Year 11 LDD/Not LDD cohorts at LA level. LAs and establishments have a responsibility to track and support young people with LDD until the age of 25. For this reason it is particularly important to support these young people in getting into a destination that meets RPA requirements.

Establishment Leaver Destinations by LDD Status





Hampshire Leaver Destinations by Ethnicity



Establishment Leaver Destinations by Ethnicity



Hampshire September Guarantees and RPA Met


September Guarantees should give Year 11 leavers the opportunity to enter a destination that meets RPA. The height of the bars on graph 12 show the percentage of young people who received a September Guarantee. The colour of the bar shows the proportion of those young people who are now in a destination that meets RPA. The majority of people who had a positive guarantee went on to meet RPA, which shows the effectiveness of the September Guarantee process.

Table 12 compares the number of Year 11 leavers who had a September Guarantee with the number now in a destination that meets the RPA requirements at LA level (see appendix for the destination types that count as 'RPA Met').


Graph 13 shows that of the Year 11 leavers from The Westgate School who had a September Guarantee most are now in a destination that meets the RPA requirements.



Tables 14a and 14b show that overall the majority of Year 11 leavers do go on to a destination that matches their intended destination.

Graph 14 compares the proportion of Hampshire leavers who go on to their intended destination with the proportion of The Westgate School leavers who did so. The 'Other' category figures have not been included in graph 14, as the relevant information is not available to put them in either category.

As graph 14 shows, the proportion of The Westgate School leavers going on to their intended destination is higher the Hampshire average.

Further Education Establishments Attended

Certain factors, such as the courses offered by an FE establishment, can greatly affect the gender ratio of those who attend. Table 15 shows the establishments attended, as of 1st November 2014, by the Year 11 leavers from The Westgate School who continued in full-time education at establishment level. The figures include any young people academically aged Year 11 who are repeating a year of statutory education.


